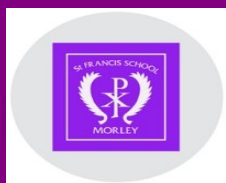

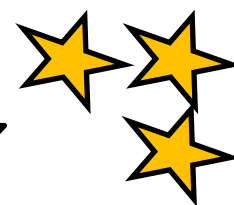

KS2 Irish Cultural day

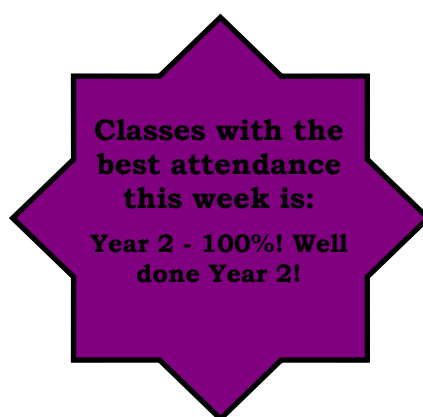
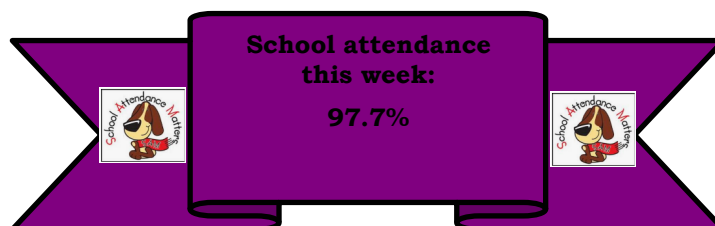
