St Francis Church – Re-opening for Private Prayer

I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'

This is the theme chosen by Bishop Marcus for the re-opening of our churches.

Canon Galvin has been preparing for the re-opening of the church** for private prayer. **Our Dean is expected to sign off on the arrangements on Monday. We hope to open:

Wednesday evenings, 6.30 – 7.30 pm, starting on 1 July

** Sunday mornings, 9.30 – 11.30 am, starting on 5 July**

These will depend on arrangements being approved. Unless you receive a message to the contrary, we will be open.

Once the church is open, parishioners should expect to see some changes and will need to follow the directions of the stewards. We can only accommodate a maximum number in church at any one time (to be determined), so we are suggesting that people only stay for 10-15 minutes. There will be a one-way system in and out and all will be expected to hand sanitize. There will be no movement around the church, touching statues etc and there will be NO toilet facilities. All arrangements are necessary to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all parishioners.

There has been a good response to the appeal for volunteers but you can still volunteer if you wish. Volunteers should not be anyone who is sheltering or members of their household, those who have other health issues or those in any of the vulnerable groups.

Pope adds three new invocations to the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary

"Mater misericordiae", the Latin for "Mother of mercy"; "Mater spei", or "Mother of hope"; and "Solacium migrantium", or "Solace of migrants" are the new invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Litany of Loreto, which is often recited at the end of the Rosary. From Vatican News

The addition that Pope Francis has made to the Litany of Loreto, was made public by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, on Saturday. It was timed for the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, June 20.

In a letter to the presidents of bishops' conferences worldwide, Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect of the Congregation, and its Secretary, Archbishop Arthur Roche, note that through the course of centuries, Christians have been using innumerable invocations and titles to call upon the Virgin Mary, "as the privileged and sure way to an encounter with Christ".

Responding to the needs of our time

In an interview, Archbishop Roche explained that these invocations "respond to the realities of the time that we are living". Speaking to Vatican News, he said that many people across the world who are afflicted in many ways, not only by the Covid-19 pandemic, but also forced from their homes because of poverty, conflict and other reasons, are invoking Our Lady.

Invocations not new

Archbishop Roche said that the Holy Father wanted to respond to this moment by including these invocations. The archbishop pointed out that these invocations are not new because they are part of the tradition of the Church that go back many centuries, such as the prayer and hymn, "Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, Hail our hope...".

Pope Francis says that the coronavirus pandemic has shown how much the poor are disconnected from society. Poverty is often hidden away, he says, but trying to help others can help us rediscover ourselves.

New Deacon for the Leeds Diocese: Chris Butler

Six Third Year students from the Pontifical Beda College in Rome were ordained Deacon by Cardinal James Harvey in the college chapel on Wednesday 17 June. Cardinal Harvey referred to the candidates for ordination as the 'Covid Deacons' and because of the pandemic, the ordinations took place without guests and with strict protocols of masking and sanitising.

Chris was a long-standing and well-known member of the congregation at Leeds Cathedral. He comes from a medical background and is a key member of the medical team that accompanies the annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes. He will be returning to the Diocese in the near future to take up a parish-based pastoral appointment during the summer months before returning to Rome for his final year of studies in the autumn.

Unlocking St Matthew's Gospel with Voices from the Diocese of Leeds

The latest in a series of our 'Stay Safe' resources produced to celebrate the *Year of the Word* is now available online is *St Matthew's Gospel Unlocked*: a recording of the entire Gospel of St Matthew using readers of all ages, backgrounds and accents from parishes, schools and institutions throughout the Diocese of Leeds.

A response to the COVID-19 Lock-down (hence the title 'Unlocked'), the project has involved more than 150 people who have contributed by recording passages at home using mobile 'phones, tablets and computers. Separate recordings have been edited together to form a series of 11 podcasts of roughly equal length. Also included is a video in which a member of the Hard of Hearing Community communicates a passage using sign language.

Year of the Word promoter Deacon Henry Longbottom who helped coordinate and edit the Matthew Unlocked project said, 'I have been overwhelmed with the generosity and enthusiasm of our people who have taken up the challenge to make the recordings so quickly.
