# Today (13 November) is the Anniversary of the Episcopal Ordination of Bishop Marcus Stock (2014).

**PACT (Prison Advice and Care Trust)**: Christmas 2020 is going to be a very difficult time for many people. About 80,000 men in prison and some 4,000 women will be 'locked down' in one of the 117 prisons in England and Wales, and with very minimal family contact. Some 89,000 children will have at least one parent in prison at this special time. PACT has established a Christmas Gift Scheme to help strengthen links between imprisoned parents and their children. In past years the Scheme has involved gift parcels but this year, for obvious reasons, it is simpler to ensure that a BOOK TOKEN FOR £10 is sent in a Christmas card from the parent to the child. ## **REMEMBRANCE: 1945-2020**

Seventy-five years ago, in Nov 1945, the nation gathered in Remembrance for the first time since the end of WWII and on the first occasion that the dead of two world wars were remembered in peacetime. This year's Remembrance Sunday on 8 Nov was unlike any other since that time but that does not mean that the sacrifice of those who gave their lives in the World Wars of the twentieth century will be forgotten. **We will remember them.** 

Marking three quarters of a century since the end of World War II, Fr Nicholas Hird and Dr James Hagerty prepared a short history of the Diocese of Leeds in the years 1939-45 and the impact of the war on the local Church. It serves as a salutary reminder of the hardships and anxieties experienced by a previous generation as we face the challenges of the present. You can read or download a copy of their study from the diocesan website (12 pages).

Also James Hagerty recently published \*\*No Ordinary Shepherds \*\*– \*Catholic Chaplains to the British Forces in the Second World War. \*Over 900 chaplains served all branches of the armed forces throughout the war. Relying on evidence that includes hitherto unseen personal records and papers, James Hagerty tells the many and varied stories of unarmed priests who willingly went into battle alongside the men and women they had volunteered to serve. This book follows Dr Hagerty's ground-breaking history of Catholic chaplains in the First World War, **Priests in Uniform**, described by *The Tablet* as 'a comprehensive and compelling portrait'.
