## **Polling Station**

The Nursery building will be used as a polling station on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May. The children's entrance will be used by voters. Nursery children and year 2 children will enter by the main entrance. Reception and Year 1 will enter by the Reception gate next to the main entrance path. Years 3,4,5, and 6 will enter their classrooms by the playground. The same arrangements will be used for collection of the children at the end of the day. The Nursery children will be in the hall on polling day.





















### **Holy Communion**

Benches will be allocated one per family. The children will sit with staff at the front of church. Mrs Foley is arranging a brunch after the Holy Communion Mass for the children in the community room. There will be a celebration assembly in school on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> May. The Holy Communion children will lead the assembly, parents are invited and the children will wear their Holy Communion clothes. There will be a class party after assembly.

## **Marian Assembly**



Year 4 will lead a Marian service on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May at 9:10 am. Parents of the year 4 children are invited to attend. We ask the children to bring a small bunch of flowers each to present to Mary. The flowers are then donated to a local old people's home and used to decorate our RE tables in school.

### Walk to school Week

Walk to School Week 2022 will take place between 16<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> May. This year the theme is all about health benefits of walking to school, with each day of the week focusing on a different health benefit: The children will receive 50 house points for walking to or from school daily.

- 1. **Healthy body -** Daily exercise helps to reduce the risk of childhood obesity and medical conditions such as cancer and heart disease later in life.
- 2. **Health and happiness -** Regular walking helps to keep young minds healthy and alert ready for their arrival at school.
- 3. **Healthy habits -** Getting into the habit of an energetic walk at the start of the day encourages other healthy habits like eating a nutritious breakfast every morning.
- 4. **Healthy friends and family-** The walk to school is an opportunity for quality family time or a good chat with friends helping to develop strong, happy relationships.
- 5. **Healthy environment -** Walking rather than taking motorised transport means less pollution and cleaner air a benefit for everyone!
