


My all time favourite novel at the moment is one of the Harry Potter collection books, part 2 (The chamber of secrets) as it is mysterious, interesting and above all adventurous.

ciation in RE and have been looking at our new text 'Toys in Space' in our English! It has been a super fun week!






This week in Year 2 we have been busy practicing our jumping skills during our fitness topic and talking about friendships in PSHE.

1st Sunday of Advent
